

CENTRAL PUBLIC SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR CODE

Central Public School promotes responsibility, respect, civility and academic excellence in a safe learning environment.

Students use three steps to solve problems: 1) Say stop. 2) Walk away. 3) Tell the duty teacher.

Type	Expectations	Consequence
<i>A Concern</i> <i>(teacher directed - per month)</i>	Every student displays good work habits, respect and classroom behaviours. Homework is regularly completed.	A concern note is sent home to inform parents of the particular concern. Following a home discussion, the note is signed and returned. Three concerns in one month are discussed with the principal and she may send a note home.
<i>A Warning</i> <i>(teacher or principal directed - per school year)</i>	Students follow all rules in and out of the school. Spitting, rough play, gum chewing, disturbance, throwing anything but a ball, or lack of concern about class work are dealt with at the office and documented.	A warning letter is sent home to inform the family of the incident. After the problem is discussed, the note is signed and returned. Adequate disciplinary actions are taken. Repeated warnings become orange letters.
<i>An Unacceptable Behaviour</i> <i>(principal or teacher directed - per school year)</i>	Students are respectful and fair. Fighting, bullying, threatening, using inappropriate language, stealing, refusing to follow teacher's directions, lying, defacing property, or harassing are documented and disciplined by the principal.	An orange letter is sent home explaining the incident and consequence. After discussing the behaviour and consequences at home, the bottom section is returned signed. <i>A suspension may be the immediate result, should the incident be serious.</i>

Dress Code

To promote a positive learning environment, students must dress appropriately. Skirts and shorts go to the fingertips; tops and bottoms meet to cover stomachs; necklines, pictures and writing on shirts are appropriate; shoulders are partially covered (3 finger rule); and armholes are the proper size. Hats are removed indoors. Proper fitting and safe shoes are worn. Inappropriate dress will result in a call home and removal from class.

Bus Behaviour

Riding the bus is a privilege. Improper bus behaviour is reported to parents by the principal following a bus report. Consequences are: 1st report = warning, 2nd report = loss of bus privileges for 3 days, 3rd Report = loss of bus privileges for 8 days, 4th Report = indefinite bus suspension.
